Kellie Cronin and John Todd Unveil New Plan: The Omega Wellness Center for Sustainable Living

Trailer 34 news agency reported today that Omega Institute is planning to include a new Omega Wellness Center extension into the Omega Center for Sustainable Living. The plan, devised to meet both the challenges of Clinton Corner zoning laws and increase Omega's income is being hailed as a stroke of brilliance.
