

## Mayor Milford Seeking Third Term Officials Expect Large Turnout for April 1st Election

Trailer 34 news agency reported today that Mayor Andrew Milford is gearing up for an unprecedented third term as Mayor of Trailer Park, NY.

Mayor Milford, running on a platform of hope and transparency, issued an executive order insuring that the polls would stay open as registered voters were in line on election day. Officials expect a very large turnout, and are upgrading the parking lot and bathrooms of all Trailer Park polling venues to be able to handle the potential onslaught of voters. In a speech before the Trailer Park council, Mayor Milford emphasized personal responsibility and financial accountability, promising to continue cutting taxes for all who live in Trailer Park, NY with the exception of those who live in the wealthier Chalet region, who can expect a small increase. The Mayor also said in his inspiring address that Trailer Park residents must

end their dependence on Omega Institute's heating oil and should explore being more self sufficient when it comes to their energy program. In light of this, Mayor Milford introduced legislation before the council to fund research in harnessing the strong wind and hot air that are part of this regions traditional weather patterns.

Opponents of the mayor drummed up their attacks against his policies, most of them from prominent radio talk show host Steve Cleaver. "I hope the mayor fails," Cleaver said in his weekly Leave It To Cleaver radio program that airs from Bard College. Cleaver, who some say is the most powerful radio talk show host in the Hudson Valley, held nothing back in his sharp ridicule of the mayor.

"I know all he really wants is to be King," Cleaver continued in his on the air rant. A recent poll however confirms that Mayor Milford enjoys wide support in the upcoming election, leading all of his contenders by a thirty point margin. When asked if



he would attend the Mayors inaugural ball this year by a mysterious caller who spoke faster than Mercury with an accent not all could understand, Steve Cleaver responded that if the LaPlante sisters would be there then so would he.

"I may not like the mayor, but that doesn't mean I am not a patriotic member of Trailer Park, NY," Cleaver said.
